Theme Overview

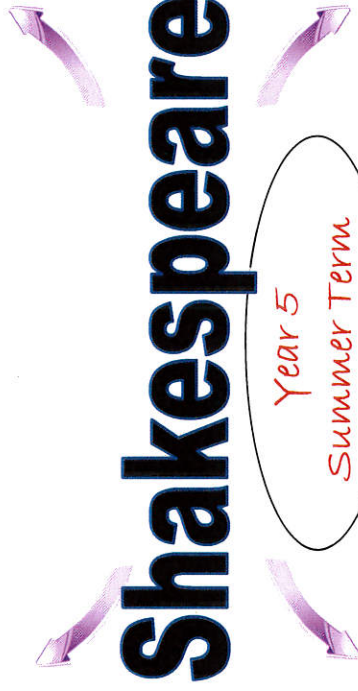
- To gain an understanding into the works of Shakespeare.
