Olympics



<p><b><u>Literacy</u></b></p> <p>Part of our literacy this term will be linked to our topic on the Olympics where they will write their own diary entries as an athlete. We will continue to look at various writing styles through the techniques of Pie Corbett. Children will read example stories, will act them out and retell them then create their own versions of the story. Children will then write their own short stories based on the horror/spooky genre. Children will continue to have daily guided reading sessions looking at texts from famous authors and answering related comprehension questions showing their understanding.</p>	<p><b><u>Science: Earth and Space</u></b></p> <p>Children will learn about how the planet Earth orbits the Sun and how the moon orbits the Earth. They will learn about day and night, including the four seasons. Moving on to looking at the planets and the Solar System. They will learn about the concepts of Gravity and space exploration.</p>	<p><b><u>Numeracy</u></b></p> <p>Children will look at converting between different units of time into common measurements. Children will then move on to shapes, where they will identify shapes, find missing angles and solve problems using their knowledge of shapes.</p> <p>Children will work to develop their mental strategies for all areas of numeracy including multiplication facts. Children will continue to develop their methods for the four main operations.</p>
<p><b><u>Geography/History</u></b></p> <p>Our Geography will be linked to our topic on the Olympic games. Children will locate Brazil (Rio de Janeiro) on a map. They will study the weather, population and other geographical differences between Brazil, comparing it with the UK. The children will look at negatives and positives to hosting an international event like the Olympics.</p> <p>In History children will look at the how the Olympics began with the Ancient Greek Olympics to today's modern Olympics.</p>	<p><b><u>PE: Striking and Fielding</u></b></p> <p>Learn how to hit and strike the ball. How to field, throw, catch and bowl. They develop their skills through games and activities, working towards playing competitive matches. Linking to our topic children will create their own Olympic event that will be used in lessons later in the term.</p>	<p><b><u>D&amp;T/Art</u></b></p> <p>In Art children will research, design and make their own Olympic mascots, symbols and make Gold, Silver and Bronze medals out of clay.</p> <p>As well as this children will practise their sketching and shading techniques.</p>
<p><b><u>ICT</u></b></p> <p>Children will continue to be taught the importance of e-safety during the term and will be reminded how to stay safe online and protect their identities.</p> <p>Children will use scratch and inkscape to code their own patterns that incorporate movement.</p>	<p><b><u>Music</u></b></p> <p>Music will be taught through the scheme of work Charanga. They will listen to famous music, learn about different ways of making music, then create and perform their own piece of music.</p> <p>Children will research and watch previous opening and closing ceremonies to the Olympics, looking at the culture of that country. This will include them performing some of their own ideas.</p>	<p><b><u>RE</u></b></p> <p>This term children will be learning about prayer and what it means in various religions. They will use this to express spiritual thinking and reflectively.</p> <p>Children will also be learning from stories from the Bible.</p>
