Literacy

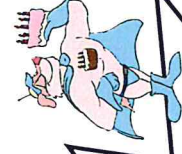
Narrative – looking at stories with heroes and villains.
Writing simple instructions.
RML phonics.
Learning to form letters correctly and looking at handwriting families.
Writing simple sentences using a full stop and a capital letter.
Spelling tricky words.
Reading words by breaking them down into sounds.
Discussing key events in stories.

Numeracy

Count reliably at least 20 objects
Estimate and check by counting
Compare and order numbers – 1 more & 1 less, 1st, last
Read and write numbers 0 to 20 and beyond
Relate addition to counting on
Understand subtraction as ‘take away’
Solving problems
Pairs of numbers that total 10
Finding missing numbers in number patterns.

Science

Distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made
Identify and name a variety of everyday materials including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock.
Describe the physical properties of everyday materials.
Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.

Art/DT

Cooking – making cakes.

Geography/History

Following instructions on a large pirate map using the programmable cars.
Using a paint program to create pictures linked to our work on celebrations.

PSHE

What makes a happy classroom?
Identifying what we are good at.
Knowing what to do if we are sad or upset.
Knowing what makes a good friend.

RE

We will be looking at the festivals of Eid, Diwali, bonfire night, remembrance Sunday, Christmas, harvest, Birthdays, Christenings.

PE

Gymnastics – children will be learning different ways of jumping, rolling, balancing and travelling.
